Dear friends,

In Portugal, I often meet people that we helped with a new start in life, who now are able to support themselves. It is absolutely fascinating to hear their stories, even though we have followed them all the way. They tell how they left the slums and how they got both home and work, thanks to our maybe small, but indefatigable and repeated words and acts. They had been helped to a school and learned to read, or they had been admitted to a detoxication institution and got rid of their addiction, or had come to a family that took care of them when they were orphans ...

Out of nothing or as little as possible, we try to achieve a good result. We can only work with the means we get, and we therefore ask everybody to give a hand to reach as many as possible. For instance we can mention the optician, Mr Sá. If somebody has a problem with his eyesight, we send used glasses with them, and sometimes he can use the lenses or sometimes the frames, and sometimes both.

How are people getting along in Portugal nowadays? The country has developed considerably since EU came here. The consequences from the arrival of hundreds of thousands of emigrants from the former colonies have diminished. This little country in the south-western part of Europe got a new start with good infrastructures and international investors, and could begin to receive tourists again.

Today, the unemployment is increasing, starting a few years back. It is evident that big parts of the population will have lack of food, exactly as in many other countries. There is a risk even in Portugal, although it is a European nation, that food might become a scarcity even there (reported by Portuguese TV newscast).

### Interview with a Voluntary Worker

Many volunteers have been faithful to the Foundation during the years. They come happily and help wherever it's needed. We want you, who have helped us during the years, to see an interview with one of them: António Santos:

# How many years have you assisted the Foundation?

If I go back and check books and records



from the social work in our churches, it could be quite many. Long before the start of ACRA, the social arm of our churches and before the legalisation of the Foundation, I was participating. Thus, from the seventies.

### What have you done in the Foundation in order to help others?

One might say that my tasks are limited to two different things. As a technical professional I repair and adjust gadgets and machines that we receive as gifts. On the other hand I am an intermediary between the social work of the churches and the Foundation. I am in the board and committees where I see and hear about enormous need and take that to the Foundation.

### What kind of result has that work brought?

Through that many institutions have been helped. We can se great results today with new organisations, through the Homes, and through direct contacts among the people. The ministry of the Foundation is not only limited to this nation, but reaches also far out to other countries, all the way to Africa.

How do you think we could be able to help as many as possible this Christmas? Looking at the situation, both in an international and worldwide perspective, help in the provision of food is the most elementary.

Which is your opinion the best way to motivate others to help the poor of Portugal? I believe that we should let others know about the needs in the country, about the summer camps, about all that is done, not only here, but also about all the arms stretching out in international contexts. About everything done in such a love. That is really worth to be supported.
